Successful completion of first group of DIM - Level 7

Imperial College of New Zealand is proud to announce the successful completion of their very first group of students attending the Diploma in Management – Level 7.

The aim of the diploma is to develop professionals who wish to embark on a professional occupation as business managers, to develop relevant skills and best practice for business operators who

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can educate, advocate for and promote understanding of best management practice.

Group of nine students, who first joined the diploma in management - level 7 in Feb/March 2014 were graduated in Feb/March 2015. These graduates are eligible to obtain (if not obtained in the past) a one year open job search visa.

Imperial College of New Zealand is pleased to share that two of the graduates have already obtained the closed work permits based on their job titles. This is the practical evidence of the value of the DIM qualification.
