Congratulations to Eui Suk Kim and Devinder Singh who received the awards for good attitude

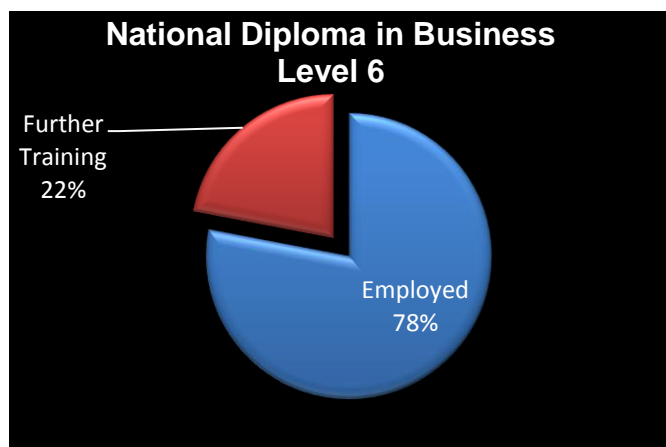

2014 Intakes

NDBL5 intakes are:

- 27th Jan, 17th March, 5th May, 2nd June, 4th Aug, 8th Sept, 27th Oct, 1st Dec

NDBL6 intakes are:

- 17th Feb, 31st March, 5th May, 23rd June, 21st July, 13th Oct, 27th Oct

General English intakes are:

- Every Monday (except if public holiday falls on Monday).

Interpreter Course intakes are:

- 13th Jan, 14th April, 21st July, 27th Oct

TESOL intakes are:

- 24th Feb, 2nd June, 8th Sept

English Language entry Requirements – NDB Level 5

Applicants who do not have English as a first language or who have studied in a country where their language of instructions in the school at primary and secondary level is not English will need to meet one of the following English requirements:

- Academic IELTS score of 5.5 with no band score lower than 5.0 **OR**
- TOEFL paper based test (PBT) score of 550 (with an essay score of 5 TWE) **OR**
- TOEFL Internet based test (IBT) score of 46 or higher (with a writing score of 20) **OR**
- University of Cambridge ESOL Examinations: FCE with a pass at Grade C or CAE with a score of 47 **OR**
- NZCEL: Level 4 with the Academic endorsement **OR**
- Pearson Test of English (Academic): PToE (Academic) score of 42 **OR**
- City & Guilds IESOL: B2 communicator with a score of 42 **OR**
- Imperial Internal English Proficiency Test

English Language entry Requirements – NDB Level 6 and Diploma in management Level 7

Applicants who do not have English as a first language or who have studied in a country where their language of instructions in the school at primary and secondary level is not English will need to meet one of the following English requirements:

- Academic IELTS score of 6.0 with no band score lower than 5.5 **OR**
- TOEFL paper based test (PBT) score of 550 (with an essay score of 5 TWE) **OR**
- TOEFL Internet based test (IBT) score of 60 or higher (with a writing score of 20) **OR**
- University of Cambridge ESOL Examinations: FCE with a pass at Grade B or CAE with a score of 52 **OR**
- NZCEL: Level 5 with the Academic endorsement **OR**
- Pearson Test of English (Academic): PToE (Academic) score of 50 **OR**
- City & Guilds IESOL: B2 communicator with a score of 66 **OR**
- Imperial Internal English Proficiency Test

*Under the Rule 18.1 of the NZQF Programme Approval and Accreditation Rules 2013, student needs to provide the evidence of **one of the following** to meet English language requirements:*

- *Completion of all primary education and at least 3 years of secondary education (that is, the equivalent of New Zealand Forms 3 to 5 or years 9 to 11) at schools using English as the language of instruction;*
- *Completion of at least 5 years of secondary education (that is, the equivalent of New Zealand Forms 3 to 7 or years 9 to 13) at schools using English as the language of instruction.*
