# Admission Process – Follow These Simple Steps

- Your application will be assessed, and you will be notified of the outcome within five (5) working days.
- We may invite applicants for an **interview** as part of the assessment process.
- An Offer Letter will be issued to successful applicants who meet the eligibility criteria and satisfy all admission requirements.
